Pupil Premium

As you may know, Pupil Premium is a type of funding that schools receive to help pupils achieve better outcomes. Eligibility for this funding depends on a family's circumstances and income.

The following groups are eligible for Pupil Premium:

- ❖ Pupils who are recorded as being eligible for Free School Meals, or who have been recorded as being eligible within the last 6 years. Please refer to the separate letter within the transition pack for further information relating to the eligibility criteria for Free School Meals.
- Children who are looked after.
- Children who were previously looked after.

There is also a Service Pupil Premium, which applies to the following children:

- One parent must serve in the regular armed forces. This includes pupils with a parent who is on full commitment as part of the full-time reserve service, and those who have a parent in the armed forces of another nation who is stationed in England.
- Pupils who have been registered as a 'service child' on any school census in the past 6 years.
- Pupils with one parent who died whilst serving in the armed forces, when the pupil receives a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme.

Although Pupil Premium funding is allocated directly to the school, it must be focused on effective approaches to raising the educational attainment of eligible pupils.

Every school must report to the government, parents and carers, to show how the funding has been spent and the planned benefits of this for pupils.
