










Prayer and the Month of Mary

Room 5 / Emmaus access: message from Ms Platt

After half term there will be a change to the way pupils access Room 5 and Emmaus. All access to these two spaces will be done via the on-call system. If a child requests access to either space, Pastoral staff will attend in the first instance to triage the situation and decide whether this is appropriate. On some occasions pupils may just need a few minutes on the corridor, a movement break or access to partner teacher. If it is felt that regulation in Emmaus or access to Room 5 is appropriate your child will be escorted there.

We want to assure you that access to these spaces is not being removed but we will be increasing the expectations on children to remain in their classes wherever possible. This will ensure these spaces can remain open and available to children who need this support.

Pupil Passports will be updated in September to reflect these changes.

After half term we will share this information with pupils during assemblies and form time.
