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Reading

In order for pupils to achieve excellent outcomes reading is a focus for all pupils at All Saints Catholic College. As a community we strive to empower all pupils to become confident readers, regardless of their starting point. As a community we understand the power that reading provides for our pupils and their families which is why we offer a rigorous programme of intervention/ support. All pupils have their reading ages tested every term using Accelerated Reader. From these tests we decide which level of intervention/ support is most appropriate for each pupil.

Attendance

Regular attendance at school is vital if you want to achieve your full potential. Good habits in both attendance and punctuality are essential for both education and employment.

Each week your form tutor will update you on your attendance, pupils who achieve 100% attendance will have the chance to attend rewards afternoons, vouchers and exciting trips.

If you are off, then your parent or carer will be expected to report your absence and we ask that you bring your form tutor a note on your return to school, which includes the reason you were off. Our Attendance Officer will be monitoring your attendance closely, along with your Head of Year and form tutor. We ask that all appointments (doctors, dentist) are made out of school hours wherever possible. You will need to have these appointments recorded in your homework diary and authorised by the Attendance Officer.

Holidays are not allowed to be taken during term time and will not be authorised.

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School Uniform

<u>Girls</u>

- Navy blue pleated College skirt or navy blue trousers
- Plain black socks (no bows) OR black tights
- White Blouse
- College Tie

<u>Boys</u>

- Navy blue trousers (straight leg fit)
- Plain black socks
- White shirt

- Navy blue encrested v-necked jumper

<u>PE Kit</u>

- Navy crew neck training top with logo
- Navy PE shorts with logo
- Sports socks with logo

- Reversible training top with logo
- Training track pants with logo

School Bag – Must be a rucksack – we do not allow hand bags/shoppers

Hair - Hair colour must be of one colour and natural in appearance.

Haircuts/styles must not be 'extreme' and not be less than a 'number 3'. Styles with a 'step' (shaving the sides of the head) or which are unkempt are not allowed. Lines and patterns in haircuts are not permitted.

Equipment

Every day you will be expected to bring the following items to school:

- Black Pen
- Red Pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Sharpener
- Rubber
- Journal
- Scientific calculator
- Reading book

Do not bring scissors. If you need to use them in lesson, your teacher will provide them.

Mobile Phones

At All Saints we believe that pupils have the right to access education without the distraction and disruption caused by mobile devices. This policy must be strictly adhered to and if mobile devices are seen, heard or used by students outside of the following rules, they will be confiscated and handed into the office where parents/carers can collect between 3pm-4pm. Parents/Carers are asked not to put the staff in a difficult situation by asking for devices to be returned early when students have been in breach of school policy.

Mobile Devices Guidelines

• Students must not use a mobile device or headphones anywhere in school during the

school day, except under the specific direction of a teacher. For the purposes of this policy,

the school day begins the moment the student enters the school grounds and ends at

3:10pm.

• Students must not photograph or record other students unless explicit permission is

given by a teacher and consent is obtained from the students photographed. Students

must show the resulting picture / footage to the teacher and students involved on request

and delete said picture / footage if instructed. Failure to do so will result in the confiscation

of the device until the picture / footage is removed.

• Students must not photograph staff without their explicit permission.

• Parents / Carers wishing to contact their son / daughter during the school day should contact the school. We have a well-established and efficient system for getting the messages to students as well as offering pastoral support if it is needed.

• Students who need to contact parents during the course of the school day should speak to their Pastoral Lead or Pupil Progress Lead, who will make a phone available.

• Mobile devices in school are the students' responsibility. They should be switched off and kept securely bags or pockets or handed in to Form Tutors, Pastoral Leads or Pupil Progress Lead.

• Students who need to use a mobile after school should do so in a safe place within the school grounds and not on the main road, in line with police advice about mobiles being a major source of street crime.

• Mobile devices may be confiscated as part of investigations into behaviour / safeguarding incidents. A senior staff member will manage this confiscation in line with safeguarding policy. Parents will be contacted. Content on mobile devices will only be viewed in the presence of the student and only if appropriate. In certain circumstances, mobile devices may be passed to the police.

• Parents will be notified by Class Charts if their child's mobile device has been confiscated and this also serves as a receipt. Devices will be kept securely, in a locked cupboard, in the school office.

• The school cannot accept any responsibility for the loss of mobile devices which have been brought onto school premises.

Other Prohibited

Just to remind you that the following items are also not allowed in school:

- Energy/Hydration drinks e.g. Monster, Lucozade, Lucozade Sport, Boost, Prime etc.
- Chewing gum

- Make up
- Piercings including ears
- Jewellery (apart from a watch)
- Acrylic/false nails
- Nail Polish
- False eyelashes
- Fake tan
- Trainers (apart from wearing in PE)
- Hoodies
- Aerosols, sprays, perfume etc.
- Inappropriate hair colour
- Inappropriate haircuts (e.g. tramlines, shaved patterns etc)
- Illegal substances
- Offensive weapons
