

In the classroom we encourage pupils to be resilient, understanding that learning from their mistakes is crucial to success.

We are aiming to generate successful pupils with high aspirations, resilience, and independence so that they can maximise the opportunities they are given to progress both with their language learning and in life in general.





Assessment

KS3

Pupils complete summative assessments each half term on the skills of grammar, listening, reading, writing, speaking and phonics. Each half term a different skill set is assessed. Throughout each half term the pupils are formatively assessed through check point quizzes, vocabulary tests, translation tests and grammar tests, these are all low stakes tests and quizzes.

KS4

Pupils follow the AQA GCSE exam board for French and Spanish. Pupils complete summative assessments based on past exam questions on the skills of listening, reading and writing every term. In Y10 pupils complete a mock GCSE speaking exam and in Y11 pupils complete 2 mock speaking exams in addition to their written papers. All assessments are marked using GCSE mark schemes. Throughout each half term pupils are formatively assessed through check point quizzes, vocabulary tests, translation tests, transferable language tests, golden crunch vocab tests and grammar tests.
