### <u>RE</u>

- Year 7 Unit One: Welcome Mass allowing learners to have first-hand experience in the liturgical life of the school; seeing a Priest/Chaplaincy carry out their day-to-day.
- Art and God: the role of an artist/curator. N.B in moving forward, this information will be made explicit through a note to each PowerPoint, this will allow the teacher to discuss and make note of how R.E links to careers.
- Year 7 Unit Two: Charities
- Year 7 Unit Three: Vocation in Daily Life: this lesson specifically looks at volunteering and how this may impact the Christian life; ibid.
- Year 7 Unit Three: Social Justice and Human Rights.
- Year 7 Unit Four: Role of the Parish Priest. **Comment:** for September, this may allow an opportunity for our local priest to share how the role of a Parish Priest is a vocation/career choice.

- Unit One: what makes a leader: in examining the links between Religion and Politics.

#### Comment:

- The above lessons provide opportunities to engage critically with how Religious Education links to life choices/careers. In these lessons, learners may:
  - read case scenarios as if in the role of a: lawyer; judge; doctor; medical profession; etc, allowing the learner to imagine the role as one of the above.
  - examine specific examples, such as: Sean Devereux in year 7, who devoted his life to helping others through vocation/his career choice, (teaching).
     Martin Luther King specifically addresses the role of politics and how we challenge prejudice/discrimination.
  - Reflect on the philosophical/ethical dimensions of Religious Education and how this is put into practice. **Comment:** for example, in breaking the mitzvot's to say a life, HATZOLA.
  - Design/Create a piece of work which is similar to the role of an: artist; curator.

#### • Retreats:

This enables learners to see and experience the work of a: Youth Worker/Chaplain/Charity Worker/Priest/Outside Speaker. **Comment:** in ensuring an explicit link to careers, I will forward this email to all members of the R.E department.

# **English**

#### **Theatre Trips**

- The Book Thief 13<sup>th</sup> October 2022 (year 8)
- A Christmas Carol 7<sup>th</sup> December 2022 (years 10 and 11)
- Noughts and Crosses 17<sup>th</sup> March 2023 (year 9)

Theatre trips link to careers as they allow pupils to see how plays can be brought to the stage. There are many different job roles involved in a theatre production such as: playwright, director, actor, choreographer, designer (set/costume), makeup, hair, backstage manager, lighting director. Students can witness these roles in real time and decide whether a role in theatre production is the right one for them.

#### **Curriculum**

Years 7,8,9,10 and 11

- All year groups have been creating their own poems, descriptions, stories, diary entries and analytical written work. By allowing the students to develop their creative and analytical writing, we are enabling them to progress through each year in education, but also aid them in succeeding when they leave in year 11.
- As one of the instrumental subjects in school, English not only enables students to formulate and develop their communicative competences in English but also contributes to the formation and development of general competences to live and work more effectively, to learn other subjects well and for lifelong learning.

#### **Competitions**

• For National Writing Day, which is on the 21<sup>st</sup> of June, we are holding a writing competition for years 7, 8, 9 and 10. The pupils that wish to partake must submit either a poem, story or speech and the winner will receive a brand-new kindle.

# **Science**

- University of York Chemistry Trip. 20/9/22. Year 10 Triple Science and High Ability 24 students. Students accessed a university chemistry workshop in a laboratory for organic chemistry led by a university professor.
- Aerozone Trip. 8/12/22. Year 8 and STEM ambassadors 25 students. Students had a STEM careers talk from 2 workers at Manchester Airport.
- University of Manchester minorities talk in STEM. 1/3/23. Girls and ethnic minorities in year 9 25 students. Students had a 2-hour talk centred on getting more diversity in STEM careers.
- In school STEM careers day. (5/6/23 6/6/23). Years 7, 8 and 9 562 students in total. Students were given an introduction into STEM careers and researched STEM careers of interest.
- Hacking a career talk (5/6/23). Year 8, 9 and 10 high ability classes 70 students in total.

# **Physical Education**

- PE ambassadors is a focused group where students apply to be an ambassador at the beginning of the year.
- PE ambassadors organise clubs, advertise clubs and try and get more people to engage. They coach and officiate fixtures in Tameside and help with leading younger pupils
- We have a group of Year 9 Girl Game changers who are leading on pushing Football with younger girls in the school
- Within KS3 and KS4 lessons staff encourage students to coach and lead warm ups and drills and also to officiate games.

# **Computing**

- Within Key stage 3 lessons are deliver with reference to AI and the changing jobs market on week beginning 6<sup>th</sup> June.
- Key stage 3 lessons investigate internet and business pioneers and the development of the industry.
- Year 9 unit on imedia technical jobs and their application within the industry

# **Technology**

- Year 9 CSL, Product Design talk about what I used to make at Celestica in contract electronics.
- Repeated 3 times to all rotation groups.
- Year 7 CSL, Product Design measuring and making finger joints for bookend models. Linked to joinery and the use of key pieces of equipment for precision, linking numeracy into joinery.
- Year 11 MWA, NCFE Graphics Unit 4 LO1 careers research into the roles of Graphic Designers and related fields, training pathways, routes into Graphic Design and related careers, and progression.
- Year 11 ACH, WJEC Hospitality and Catering links to a hotel in Manchester. Visit to the Novatel. Springboard H&C summer school external link, optional one student is signing up.
- Year 10 & 11 ACH as above, unit 1 job roles of front of house, back of house, segments of H&C industry, roles and responsibilities of environmental health officer.

### **MFL**

- At the start of every topic tutors highlight the different jobs related to that topic in French/Spanish.
- E.g. Y9 town maire, town planner, hospitality industry, etc. This happens every half term with each year group.
- Y11 half term 1 we look at the topic of jobs and future careers, pros and cons of jobs and what you would like to do post 16.
- On careers days there is a focus on the relevance of MFL in jobs.

# **Humanities**

There are lessons delivered exposing pupils to jobs/ professions within some units delivered within the curriculum. For example, in year 8 lessons teachers deliver a 'Careers in Humanities' element to Year 8. This will be delivered to each class in Year 8 from 26<sup>th</sup> February.

# **Music**

### **Curriculum-based:**

Pupils look at professional roles available in the Performing Arts industry through the study of several different practitioners, such as:

- PERFORMERS Musicians, Actors, Dancers
- CHOREOGRAPHERS
- DIRECTORS Musical directors & Stage/Film directors
- DESIGNERS Set, Costume, Masks/Make-up, Lighting/Sound.
- COMPOSERS/WRITERS song writers, playwrights.
- Rehearsal techniques how to warm-up & practice like a professional when performing.
- Evaluating live theatre productions observing the professionals in practice.
- Listen to/watch professional recordings of Musicians.
- Use of professional sound/recording equipment/programs.

### Wider curriculum:

Pupils learn how professional productions are staged through annual theatre trips:

- Year 7 Pantomime (in December)
- Year 8/9 Little Shop of Horrors, Bugsy Malone, Annie,
- Year 10/11 Grease, Mamma Mia, Hamilton

Annual trip to London to experience different areas of the Performing Arts industry. Activities include:

- Annual trip to watch Westend productions
- Harry Potter Studio tour
- Backstage theatre tours

• Participate in workshops run by theatre professionals.

Annual whole-school production – experience how to be a performer, designer, choreographer, sound/lighting technician, backstage support etc.

### **SEND**

- Military mentors' intervention in school- pupils learn about values necessary in careers.
- Noah's art animal therapy- pupils learn how to look after/train animals.
- Tameside Music Service- small group sessions held for any pupils interested in pursuing Music at College
- University trip held this year- where pupils found out about support available. This was at Salford University.
- Small number of pupils attend Active Tameside where they experience different life opportunities catered to their interests.
- Social skills 1-1 with older students- we have practiced interview techniques with them prior to College interviews.
- Extra careers sessions arranged through School as necessary.
- College visits to aid transition for EHCP pupils.
