September updates

At All Saints, we have a zero-tolerance policy on mobile phones as stated in the school's behaviour policy. Currently, our policy states that: 'if mobile devices are seen, heard, or used by pupils outside of the following rules, they will be confiscated and handed into the office where parents/carers can collect between 3:15pm-4pm. If it is not be collected by a parent/carer, the phone will be returned the following Monday to the child at 3:15pm.'

According to the DfE, 'by the age of 12, 97% of children own a mobile phone, but the use of mobile phones in school can lead to distractions, disruption and can increase the risk of online bullying.'

Therefore, from September, mobile phones will be handed in during form time each morning and safely stored throughout the day. At the end of each day, they will be returned to pupils by their form tutor.
