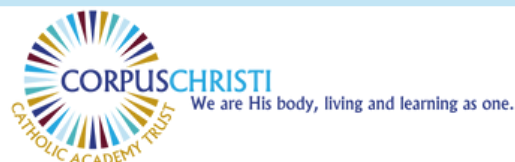


## Welcome...

SHOW ME YOU ARE MY MOTHER.

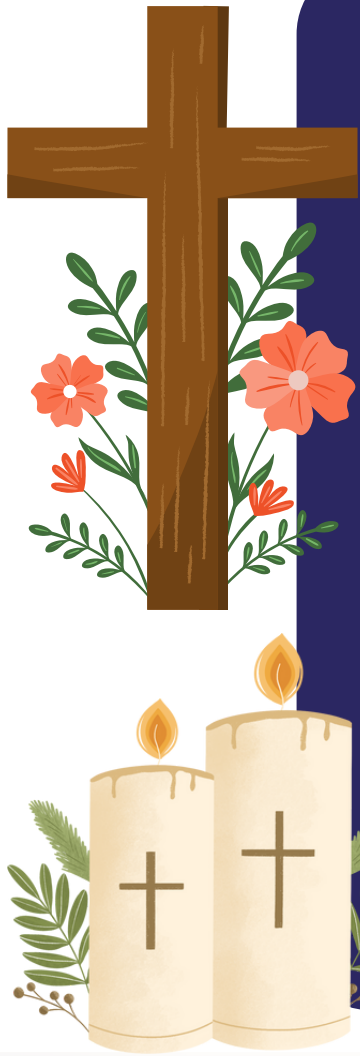
Oh, Holy Mary, Mother of God,
